

Keep Pests Away on a RANY/DAY

Guard the Gutters

Leaves in your gutters can support ant colonies and shelter pests like the American roach. When the rains come, these rooftop residents are sent scurrying to soffits and window seals. By clearing your gutters regularly and trimming trees away from the roof, you'll reduce the odds of an aerial invasion.

Close the Gap

Check for holes on the exterior of the home around vents and soffits, and the garage door seal. Caulk any cracks in your stucco, paying careful attention to areas around pipe chases and hose bibs. Even hairline cracks will allow moisture and the insects that follow.



Cut the Clutter

It's important to make your home inhospitable to reduce the chance of an infestation. Reduce clutter, especially in highly vulnerable areas. "Cardboard boxes are pest magnets – especially for roaches," says Joe Tomasiello, our resident Associate Certified Entomologist. "I always advise against their use in the home."

Using sealable plastic storage bins is an effective way to prevent pests from getting too cozy!

Toughen the Turf

Your home isn't the only place vulnerable to pests during the rainy season. An overly-saturated lawn can develop disease, fungus, and pest problems too.
